Using Google Maps, type in the following locations and write a two to three sentence description of what you see at each site, <u>working as a geographer would</u>.

Tips to help:

- 1. Use "Satellite" in the lower left to see the physical map of the item.
- 2. Zoom in, or go to "street view" in the lower right to see it from ground level
- 3. Click on 3D to get a slightly different view of the item

EXAMPLE: Irondale High School

A school complex with both wooded and suburban areas nearby. There is a football field, a track, baseball fields, and tennis courts. There are few cars in the parking lot, which indicates that it may be summer or a holiday. There may have been some additions to the school, as there are visible divisions of the roof. It's not Texas, because the football stadium only holds several thousand people. It is adjacent to (west of) Rice Creek and lots of green space.
